It certainly is not family friendly.

While it would be tempting to just skip this passage, I am reminded this is why we practice Expositional Preaching. We go verse-by-verse through books of the Bible with the intention of letting God's Word speak for itself. This has many benefits, one of which is it means sometimes we must tackle difficult or even uncomfortable passages.

Please know that my goal is to handle this passage in a tactful way. However, I would encourage parents of children to take advantage of our Children's Sunday School during the 9:00am service and Children's Church through the 5th grade at the 10:30am service.

At first, it is hard to see God's purpose in a dysfunctional story like Judah and Tamar. However, what we will see Sunday is that Genesis 38 teaches us that in the midst of a broken world, the King of Heaven is orchestrating the chaos of our lives to bring maximum glory to Jesus who alone can redeem our world!

On the eve of an election, we need that reminder.
